

Savannah and Charleston Rally

October 7 – 15, 2011



Get acquainted with two beautiful and genteel Southern cities, Savannah, GA and Charleston, SC. Steeped in history, Savannah is best known for its charming 21 historic squares, elegant architecture, ornate ironworks, fountains and grand oak trees dripping with Spanish moss.

In the charming seaport city of Charleston you will enjoy three days of touring the "Holy City", named for all the elegant steeples and spires that grace the skyline.

The 2011 Savannah-Charleston Rally will begin at Hardeeville RV Park in Hardeeville, SC, with four nights of camping before traveling to Charleston, SC.

TOUR HIGHLIGHTS DURING YOUR STAY IN SAVANNAH, GA, INCLUDE:

- **Welcome Dinner at Mrs. Wilkes House** – Since 1943 the Wilkes family has served its home style southern cooking.
- **Savannah** – guided tour of Historic District.
- **Old Fort Jackson** –the oldest remaining brickwork fort first servicing in the War of 1812 and again guarding Savannah during the Civil War.
- **Wormsloe Historic Site** – located at the end of the spectacular avenue of oaks, the tabby ruins of the colonial estate of one of Georgia's first settlers, Noble Jones offers a fine example of plantation life.
- **Lunch at The Pirates' House**
- **Savannah Theatre** – The #1 downtown entertainment extravaganza featuring award winning singers, dancers and live music.
- **Savannah Riverboat Tour** – Narrated sightseeing tour of Savannah River aboard a replica paddle wheeler.



On Tuesday, October 11, 2011, you will travel approximately 135 miles to Charleston, SC, for four nights of camping at James Island County Park Campground.

TOUR HIGHLIGHTS DURING YOUR STAY IN CHARLESTON, SC INCLUDE:

- **Charleston Crab House Dinner**
- **Guided Tour of Old Charleston** with lunch at High Cotton
- **The Citadel Military College** - Cadet Lead Tour
- **Nathaniel Russell House tour** - One of the south's grandest antebellum townhouses.
- **Fort Sumter** – tour the historic ruins of the start of the Civil War and a powerful symbol of both the South and the North.
- **USS Yorktown tour with lunch**
- **Magnolia Plantation & Gardens** – guided tour of 17th century-style estate, features year-round bloom of America's oldest gardens.

- **Drayton Hall** – many of the pivotal events of the Revolutionary War took place at this historical site where soldiers from both the British and Continental armies encamped.
- **Farewell dinner** in the heart of the historic district at Magnolias Upper Level Gallery.
